We have continued teaching our English classes during the week. It has been an enjoyment to get to know each of our students a little better. We attended a new missionaries training in Germany for two weeks. This training was very beneficial in helping us better understand how to minister to people who come from different cultural backgrounds. It was also a blessing to meet new missionaries who serving the Lord in other parts of the world. We are currently living in Ukraine under a short-term Visa and in order to get our long term Ukrainian Visas we must first leave Ukraine and apply for such visas at a Ukrainian Consulate Office that is located in another country. However, the Consulate's computer system was down most of the time that we were there and they would not accept a written application so we were unable to get our Visas while we were in Germany. It was very hard to leave Germany without our visas but, we trust in the Lord that He will provide a way for us to get them and we will try again in December. When we returned to Ukraine, Compass celebrated Thanksgiving with three big turkeys and all the fixings. After being in Ukraine for two months we decided that it would be best to buy a car to get around easier. Jim took a three-day journey into Western Ukraine to find one to fit our needs. (Thank God, we able to sale our Truck in Texas and use the money to purchase this car.)
